Park Road Gardens backs on to the railway near the centre of Grange over Sands. They have been planted with a broad mix of trees and ornamental plants to compliment the native oak trees already there. The Gardens were established in 1929 as a quiet and attractive setting for the re-sited bandstand, now with a moat. Some of the older plantings are now in need of replacement so it is a chance to choose some interesting young trees and shrubs.
