1. Corsican Pine ( <i>Pinus nigra</i> ssp <i>laricio</i> )	large buds with silver whiskers	16. Whitebeam ( <i>Sorbus aria</i> )	native to Britain. White under-leaf
2. Snake-bark Maple ( <i>Acer davidii</i> )	roundish leaves. Green/white striped bark	17. Sweet Gum ( <i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i> )	alternate 5 lobe leaves. Autumn colour
3. Cappadocian Maple ( <i>Acer cappadocicum</i> )	fast growing. Autumn leaves yellow	18. Sessile Oak ( <i>Quercus petraea</i> )	native to Britain. Good for wildlife
4. Arolla Pine ( <i>Pinus cembra</i> <i>Aureovariegata</i> )	needles with whitish top in clusters of five	19. Deodar Cedar ( <i>Cedrus deodara</i> )	upright pollen stalks in late Autumn
5. Sweet Gum ( <i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i> )	alternate leaves. Vivid Autumn colour	20. Red Horse-chestnut ( <i>Aesculus x carnea</i> )	red flowers and smooth conkers
6. Holly ornamental ( <i>Ilex aquifolium</i> )	ornamental form with golden-edged leaves	21. Hybrid Oak ( <i>Quercus x rosacea</i> )	native hybrid with Pedunculate Oak
7. Weeping Beech ( <i>Fagus sylvatica</i> <i>Pendula</i> )	weeping form of native beech	22. Cherry Plum ( <i>Prunus cerasifera</i> <i>Nigra</i> )	early pink flowers before leaves
8. Common Lime ( <i>Tilia x europaea</i> )	flowers in July. Good for bees	23. Weeping Elm ( <i>Ulmus glabra</i> <i>Pendula</i> )	survived the Dutch Elm disease
9. Mountain Pine ( <i>Pinus mugo</i> )	short needles and cones	24. Japanese Maple ( <i>Acer palmatum</i> )	paired, hand-like decorative leaves
10. Weeping Ash ( <i>Fraxinus excelsior</i> <i>Pendula</i> )	weeping form of native ash	25. Red Oak ( <i>Quercus rubra</i> )	large leaves, red in Autumn
11. Bird Cherry ( <i>Prunus padus</i> <i>Watereri</i> )	long white, scented flower clusters	26. Handkerchief Tree ( <i>Davidia involucrata</i> )	showy white bracts when flowering
12. Field Maple ( <i>Acer campestre</i> )	native to Britain	27. Magnolia ( <i>Magnolia x soulangiana</i> )	large white flowers
13. Wild Cherry ( <i>Prunus avium</i> )	selected form of British native	28. Hiba ( <i>Thujaopsidolabrata</i> )	Japanese conifer. Leaves white below
14. Walnut ( <i>Juglans regia</i> )	scented leaves and walnuts in autumn	29. Lawson's Cypress( <i>Chamaecyparis lawsoniana</i> )	many varieties available
15. Japanese Cherry ( <i>Prunus serrulata</i> <i>Kanzan</i> )	nearly pink double flowers
